#### MISSION POSSIBLE - ST. JOHN 1: 43 - 51

Jesus and Moses went golfing one day. Jesus was about to hit a shot and said, "Hey Moses, watch this! Just like Arnold Palmer!" Moses said, "Jesus, you can do anything but don't try to be like Arnold Palmer." Jesus said, "No, watch this - just like Arnold Palmer!"

Jesus hit the ball in the water so Jesus asked Moses to get the ball. Moses parted the water and got the ball. This continued for about fifteen minutes. Finally, Jesus hit the ball in the water for the seventh time. "Please get my ball for me," Jesus asked Moses. Moses said, "No, I told you to quit trying to be like Arnold Palmer, so I'm not getting it this time."

Jesus walked across the water, reached down, and got his ball. While he was doing this, a couple rode by in a cart and said, "Who does he think he is, Jesus?" Moses said, "No, He thinks he's Arnold Palmer!"

All of us can't be like Arnold Palmer, but all of us can be like Jesus! In fact, we have been called to be like Jesus – to love like Jesus – to make a difference like Jesus – to change the world like Jesus. The Bible says we have been empowered to be like Jesus.

I think this is what compelled Philip and the rest of the disciples to drop everything and follow Him. Jesus simply said to Philip, "Follow me" and he did, right on the spot. John 1:43. There was a great call of adventure and meaning to those two simple words of Jesus. Philip and the disciples couldn't resist.

Jesus' irresistible call is also seen later in the Gospel of John: "You will do greater works than me because I am going to the Father" John 14:12 paraphrased. How is it possible that we can do greater works than Jesus? Jesus has always been. In the first chapter of John we read, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." But when Jesus was on earth in human form His influence was limited. He could only heal one person at a time and teach to groups at a time but when Jesus went back to the Father, His Holy Spirit came to live in each of His followers. In this way, Jesus' influence is multiplied through us and we can reach the whole world together! This is what Jesus means by doing greater works than Him. We have been given power through the Holy Spirit to be like Jesus in this world. This is why our Mission to make disciples is possible.....!

# Northeast Region of the Global Methodist Church to Hold Convening Annual Conference in Camp Hill, PA

The Global Methodist Church's Northeast Region Conference Leadership Committee announced today details for the official convening annual conference to be held on April 11, 12 and 13 at Christian Life Assembly Church in Camp Hill, PA. The event will also be live streamed. This historic gathering will allow the establishment of this regional body of the new Methodist movement to operate in the Northeast, which currently includes 160+ churches and clergy known as the Northeast Provisional Annual Conference. This large geographic area covers congregations from Maine to parts of West Virginia and the eastern two-thirds of Pennsylvania.

Reverend Steven Taylor, the newly appointed President Pro Tem of the Northeast GMC said, "We are excited to have clergy, church members, volunteers and observers from throughout this expansive region come together to worship, set the mission and ministry of the Conference going forward, to affirm the leadership teams, and spend time getting to know each other. We are also excited to proceed with the ordination of our clergy as we begin a very bright future." He added, "We are committed to spending significant time gathering as a loving community to pray, worship and celebrate together. We have gifted leaders from across the Global Methodist Church who will inspire us to live out our call to discipleship and mission for this new movement".



After much prayer and discernment, the Northeast Provisional Annual Conference's Sessions Committee has selected the Convening Annual Conference's theme as "Moving in the Spirit". The Sessions Committee Chair, Autumn Christine said, "Our planning team felt God's hand helping us ground this conference in scriptural authority and we have aligned the design of the convening event with Galatians 5:25. We are committed to moving in the direction that aligns with God's word and this is a perfect theme for all we hope to accomplish".

The Global Methodist Church launched in May of 2022 as a movement of new Methodist denomination grounded in orthodox Wesleyan theology with Jesus Christ at the center of worship, education, and outreach.
